### In the past year, we successfully:

- Enrolled, trained and supported 924 **at-risk** children, volunteer mentors, and parents
- Held over 20 virtual statewide activities for matches, families and volunteers
- Provided additional services to families experiencing hardships due to COVID-19, including care packages, food assistance, support groups, single-parent workshops, financial scholarships, referrals and connections to other health and human service organizations and opportunities for unique activities and experiences offered through our many community partners.
- Supported youth through one-to-one mentoring programs resulting in:
  - 100% indicated greater educational expectations and parental trust/ family connectedness
  - 80% reported an improvement in grades and academic performance
  - 90% reported being more socially accepted
  - 100% reported that they now had a special and trusted adult in their life
- Offered programs and services 100% free to families
- For every dollar donated, **\$0.67** cents were spent directly on supporting our programs. We're only able to serve children who face serious trauma in their lives thanks to our generous donors, caring volunteers, and dedicated board and staff. Thank you all for your continued support.
