

**Tyler Kurashige** is the President and CEO of Big Brothers Big Sisters Hawaii, a role he assumed in January 2024. He brings nearly two decades of experience in nonprofit leadership, mentoring programs, and organizational development.

Tyler earned his Bachelor's Degree in Human Development and Family Studies from the University of Hawaii at Manoa in 2006. While working full-time at Big Brothers Big Sisters Hawaii, he pursued graduate studies in Counseling Psychology at Chaminade University and completed a Master's Degree in Public Administration with a focus on Non-Profit Management from the University of Hawaii in 2012.

Tyler's journey with Big Brothers Big Sisters Hawaii began as an intern during his college senior year in 2006. After graduation, he was hired as a Case Manager, where he developed and managed mentoring programs in the community. By 2011, he was promoted to oversee statewide school mentoring programs, where he successfully expanded services and built strategic partnerships.

In 2016, Tyler advanced to Director of Program Operations, overseeing the quality, safety, and strategic development of program services. His exceptional leadership led to his promotion in 2022 to Chief Operations Officer, where he managed internal operations across programs, finance, human resources, and technology.

Since becoming President/CEO, Tyler has spearheaded key initiatives such as the reopening of school mentoring programs across Oahu, Maui, and Kauai, increasing staffing for critical program and development roles, and forging new partnerships with nonprofits and community organizations to enhance and innovate services.
